


Benefits of a Downtown Farmers Market

According to a national survey, over one in five farmers market farmers said one of the most helpful things would be higher quality, better funded, and more targeted advertising for the markets where they sell... better signs both at the market and along high-traffic areas such as roadways.

- +1st Year for Downtown Hart Farmers Market
- +Coordinated to provide markets on alternating weeks
- +Provides access to fresh produce every week in Oceana County

What is Senior Power of Produce?

- + A program for seniors 62+ to promote healthier eating habits and increase access to fresh produce
- → Modeled after the program of the same name used at the Muskegon Farmers Market.
- + A token program that issues four tokens with a \$1 value each time a senior attends our market and registers/checks in at the SPOP booth.



How does it work?

- + Vendors are contracted with in order to accept the tokens in exchange for produce.
- + Vendors are reimbursed at the end of each market for all tokens accepted at the market.
- + If tokens are not spent at a market they can be saved and used at another New Era market.





Start Up

- + Tokens (we ordered 1,000)
- + Colored 3x5 Index Cards (we ordered 900)
- + Tabbed 3x5 Index Cards files
- + Card File
- + Date Stamp
- + Card Stock
- → Table Banner 28"x32"
- → Total Startup Costs for New Era Farmers

 Market was \$1,248.40.

Funded by NW Michigan Chronic Disease Coalition and administered by DHD 10.





Implementation

- + A funding source for reimbursing farmers for tokens
- → We applied for and received a \$3,000 grant from Mercy Health, Sister Simone Courtade fund.
